I would like to add an inclusive woodland walk to the Residential Inclusive Community Development where anyone can go to get some fresh air, relax and have fun!



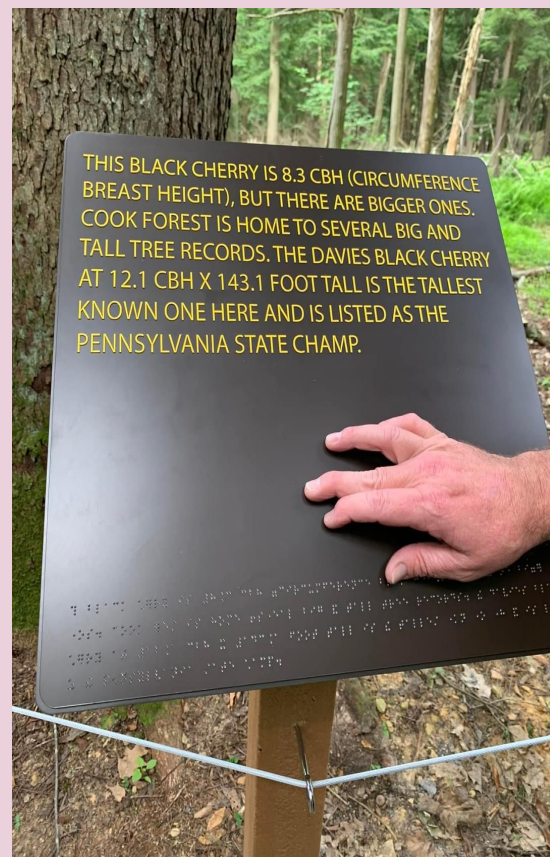
During the day people can go on a walk and enjoy all of the sensory activities there are which you can see on the second slide.
